## First Mass of a newly ordained priest

*Solemn Mass in Cork with Deacon, Sub-Deacon and Assistant Priest*

On St Patrick's day, Canon Anthony Boucheron came to Limerick and Cork to offer Holy Mass. He was ordained a priest last July by His Eminence Raymond Cardinal Burke and appointed chaplain in a school of the Institute near Paris, France.

He was delighted to come to Ireland and celebrate Holy Mass on St Patrick's day. He again publicly thanked God for the gift of the priesthood through the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.

The faithful who attended his Mass received a plenary indulgence and many of them asked him for his prayers for their intentions.

## Lætare Sunday

The custom of using rose vestments on Lætare Sunday originates from a papal tradition in which popes used to carry a golden rose, as a symbol of joy and hope in the middle of this somber season in their right hand when returning from the celebration of Mass on this day.

Originally it was natural rose, then a single golden rose of natural size, but since the fifteenth century, a cluster or branch of roses. One such rose, of pure gold and brilliant workmanship by various famous artists, was given



by a pope to the Shrine at Knock.

The popes bless one every year, and often confer it upon churches, shrines, cities, or distinguished persons as a token of esteem and paternal affection. In case of such a bestowal, a new rose is made during the subsequent year.

The golden rose represents Christ in the shining splendor of His majesty, the "flower sprung from the root of Jesse".

## St. Francis de Sales on fasting

If you are able to fast, you will do well to observe some days beyond what are ordered by the Church, for besides the ordinary effect of fasting in raising the mind, subduing the flesh, confirming goodness, and obtaining a heavenly reward, it is also a great matter to be able to control greediness, and to keep the sensual appetites and the whole body subject to the law of the Spirit; and although we may be able to do but little, the enemy nevertheless stands more in awe of those whom he knows can fast.

... I disapprove of long and immoderate fasting, especially for the young. I have learned by experience that when the colt grows weary it turns aside, and so when young people become delicate by excessive fasting, they readily take to self-indulgence...

A want of moderation in the use of fasting, discipline and austerity has made many a one useless in works of charity during the best years of his life...

In the Roman Liturgy, Matins may be considered as the most important office of the day. They suggest the symbolic signification of this Hour, the prayer of the middle of the night.

The Office is made up of the three nocturns, the first of which comprises three psalms each; nine lessons, three to each nocturn, each lesson being followed by a response.
