- 4. Colours: Chosen in this way by Bishop Fulton Sheen, (former US bishop):-
 - a) Green for Africa to represent the Savannah lands
 - b) Blue for Oceania to represent all the oceans
 - c) Red for the Americas---this is where the first flame of faith was lit
 - d) Yellow for Asia, because the sun rises in the east
 - e) White for Europe, because this is where the Pope lives.
